Causes


- Human population growth

Do governments have a role to play?

Uganda Wildlife Court

- Africa's only specialized wildlife court
- Unlimited jurisdiction in Uganda
- Over 2000 cases registered

Benefits

- Prioritization of the cases
- Increased arrests and prosecutions arrests of key players in the crime e.g extradition of Moazo Koromah.
- Expeditious adjudication over cases timely delivery of verdicts
- Uniformity in penalties
- Increased coordination, corporation and communication amongst the key players
- Reduction of recidivism
